I am writing this article before I leave for Alaska (the second time). Forecasts call for a chance of snow and temperatures between 28 – 35 degrees; I love it. Some folks don't care for the cold, but my family and I have always enjoyed it, especially when there's the crispness of coming snow in the clouds. Mother nature has her ways of reminding us that the times – they are a changing.

So too in the scriptures and so too at our parish.

The first reading notes a prophecy that, "On this mountain God will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations; he will destroy death forever. The Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from every face;"

Meditating upon this passage, one can see that Death is not something God wants, desires, or creates. Sin put death in the world – not God, and God intends on rubbing it out forever. Too often people blame God when their loved ones die, and I wish they knew the Scriptures at those times. God is on the side of rescuing us from death. Yes, for a time, we must endure it as well as sickness and suffering, but those times are changing – and one day they will be gone forever. Keep faith, and don't lose hope in the promise of the Gospel and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The times are changing here at St. Martha's too. Some of our mass times will change. I reviewed our parish survey from last year, and every week we track mass attendance. The early changes are coming to better match the reality of our clergy resources and of our in pew community. Please read carefully:

The Saturday evening mass will move from 5pm to 4:30pm starting in January 2018. Why this change? The community that comes to the vigil are in large part seniors, and driving in the winter with decreased sunlight and headlight glare becomes more of a challenge. Saturday confessions will still be heard at 3pm, and Saturday weddings will continue as well.

The 4pm Sunday mass will continue in 2018 until August. Why this change? The summer usually is the best time for priests' vacations as the sacramental prep, Advent and Lent, Christmas and Easter business subside. I intend, so far as possible, to continue aiding the missions and serving in Alaska each August. Reducing our mass count by 1, although seemingly small, helps my retired priests. It isn't easy to pour out yourself each Sunday morning, after a full week, and then crank it back up come Sunday afternoon after 1pm baptisms and other Sunday meetings. When I am gone, all this, and emergency calls, falls to our retired men. Priests are like EMT's. . .it's a wonderful life, but not always easy.

The 4pm Sunday mass may return after August, I'm not going to cancel it yet – or promise it will endure. It depends upon the health of my retired priests come August, the cooperation of our surrounding parishes to help, and my own health. I am hopeful we will bring it back in Sept, but we will make that call when we are much closer to August.

The parish mass book opens up Wed. Oct 18th at 8:45am. Requesting a mass intention for a loved one, for one's family, for a deceased friend is a praiseworthy spiritual work of mercy. The forms in this bulletin can be brought with you on the 18th. If you hand them in early, you may not get the date you requested as first preference will be given to those present in person. There are only so many masses and dates, so please be flexible and understanding. Please limit requests to 2 per family until the wider opening of the book come January. You can always request an unlimited # of novena mass intentions and give your loved ones a series of 9 masses as opposed to 1 dedicated mass.
